WANDERING THOUGHTS (as we see them)

Whoops! We reported that the rainfall amount on the 12th was 10 inches – not quite – should have read 4/10 of an inch -- thanks to our “spy” – it actually was a trick to see how many readers caught it! **WORKING TO IMPROVE
THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM**

Sun Country Health Region is embarking on another year of strategies to improve the health care system on which you rely. The 2015-16 fiscal year will be one of retrenchment; completing or sustaining very necessary practices that we were unable to satisfactorily conclude last year, and working closely with the Ministry of Health and other health regions in the province to ensure the Saskatchewan Health Care Management system is working "as one."

The four projects chosen this year are: Stop Staff Injuries (Zero Injuries by 2020); Stop the Line Safety Alert System; Appropriate Use of Antibiotics, and Hand Hygiene to Stop Infections.

The first one is very ambitious but challenging to implement. In SCHR, we want a workplace culture that is fully committed to preventing and reducing workplace injuries. We do not want our employees injured at work. We want them where we need them to provide services. The second project is related but refers to stopping any action or behavior that might have the potential to cause an injury to either a patient or employee. To reach that goal, we need a workplace where patients and staff feel comfortable speaking up when they see something that is hazardous.

The third project refers to the use of antibiotics. The SCHR team, including doctors, staff and patients, want to ensure that antibiotics are used appropriately, that health care personnel and patients understand when antibiotics should be prescribed and why, thus reducing antimicrobial resistance.

The fourth project, hand hygiene to stop infections, is being replicated across the Region. The correct hand-washing process and environmental cleaning methods need to be sustained. A plan was developed to include sufficient trainers, a standard process for trainers, improved reporting methods, and better tools for auditing and consistent visual management. During the course of our busy work days, the tendency is to not meet expectations 100 per cent of the time. This year, we will do better.

All four projects are intended to ensure we provide top quality care for the patients/residents/clients we serve in our facilities and programs.

We also have a responsibility to work with the provincial health system to provide better care in all facilities, including urban emergency departments where people are waiting long hours for care and admission. We do our part to improved patient flow by bringing SCHR residents back to recuperate in their home communities after receiving health care in Regina or Saskatoon.

The sooner we accept our residents home with home care, or to one of our facilities, the sooner more of those beds in the larger centres will be available for new patients.

Those strategies provide us with direction and plans for the new fiscal year. We will devote time and resources to achieve our goals.

A WEEK IN THE LIFE OF NEWS-IN-A-MINUTE

Monday – my people start receiving material for the current week's issue via e-mail, phone, word of mouth. (Sometimes this even begins 2 – 3 days previous.)

Tuesday – almost a carbon copy of Monday – plus any inserts are copied. Some pre-typing of the newsletter might be started.

Wednesday – with cutoff at noon, the morning is spent gathering all material – plus writing up news-worthy events/columns. Right after the deadline, my people meet to organize the layout. Then one person types, organized pages, seeks for fill-ins, graphics, etc. This takes most of the afternoon and sometimes typing continues well into the evening.

Thursday – my people meet and do a brief proof-read (sometimes an error slips by – sorry). Then one person heads to the copying machine =- taking about 2 – 3 hours (on a good day). While the copier works away, this same person almost keeps up with the folding. At copying completion, the person recruits the “stuffers” who place the pages in order – taking 1 – 1½ hours. The counting then takes place for each destination. The administration part comes next – billing, etc. The expired material is garbaged and the continuing ads, etc. are filed for the next week.

Friday – is delivery of “the finished product” – around Town, to neighbouring communities, etc. This usually takes 3-4 hours depending on “how full the coffee pots are”. Copies of the finished product are also e-mailed to about 70 individuals and arrangements made to get the newsletter on the Wawota web page.

Saturday – sometimes one or the other person are asked to attend an event to report on.

Sunday – supposed to be their “day of rest” – doesn't always happen! Quite often quarterly billing is done this day.

Our point – News-in-a-Minute doesn't just happen with a “flick of the nose” or a “twitch of the finger”. With a lot of community cooperation we make it happen – thanks for all your support, encouragement, submissions and donations.

Some Uses for VINEGAR ...

- Kill grass on walks and driveways. Pour full strength on unwanted grass.
- Kill weeds. Spray full strength on growth until plants have starved.
- Increase soil acidity. In hard water areas, add a cup of vinegar to a gallon of tap water for watering acid loving plants like rhododendrons, gardenias, or azaleas. The vinegar will release iron in the soil for the plants to use.
- Freshen cut flowers. Add 2 tablespoons vinegar and 1 teaspoon sugar for each quart of water.
- Prolong the life of flowers in a vase. Add two tablespoons of vinegar plus three tablespoons of sugar per quart of warm water. Stems should be in three to four inches of water.
- Clean pots before repotting, rinse with vinegar to remove excess lime.
- Deter ants. Spray vinegar around door and window frames, under appliances, and along other known ant trails.
