3 Tbsp vinegar

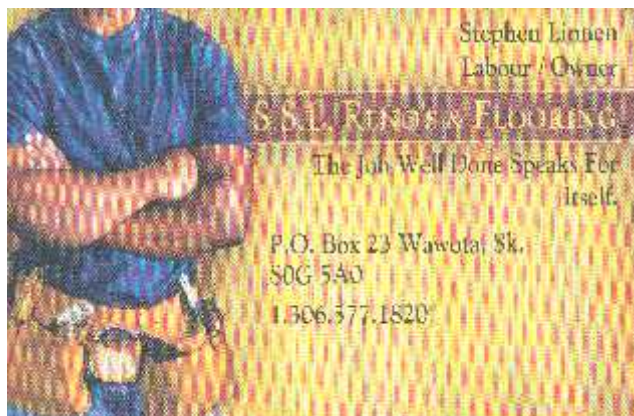
2 Tbsp pickling salt
