WANDERING THOUGHTS

(as we see them)

Temperatures are not the only thing that was on the rise in the past week – gas prices decided to increase. The reason this time is higher wholesale costs – thus the “ripple” effect! And “To add insult to injury”, they tell us that we could see \$1.30/litre before it stops!

And the temperatures – some places, reaching the 40° mark – “wilting-time”. One story we heard that a shopper had bought cookie dough – left in the back window of their closed-up car – viola – returned to baked cookies ... well maybe!

On our “paper trail” we saw one combine going – doing barley or winter wheat we expect. Some canola is being swathed and many fields of cereal crops nearing the “ready stage”. Reports are that yields are average or lower than normal. Heard one report of barley yielding 80 bushels per acre – and going malting! We hope for the best for our farmer friends – a safe and productive harvest.

Even though fall doesn't officially arrive for another 33 days, we see signs already of changing seasons. The least bit of a breeze sees dead dry leaves falling; the Mountain Ash trees are loaded with orange berries; most lawns are taking on that “ready to relax” look. Flower displays are showing signs of “end of season beauty”. A couple of zinnia displays – 304 Lonsdale Street and 6A-600 Railway Avenue are at their peak and very showy. (Every year we promise to grow zinnias – so far no show – next year?)

Quite evident of a bumper apple/crab apple crop. A friend on Lonsdale Street tells us that their tree was dropping fruit but still many on the tree. The other day the tree could no longer carry the load and broke off. It was an old tree that had obviously served its time.

Sometimes Lady Luck “shines down” on those who wait – and wait – and wait. On July 29th someone predicted that a band member would win the 50/50 draw at the Kenosee Lake Dance – not one but two band members were winners! On August 12th, the same someone again predicted a band member would win and this time the someone won! (Wish we could predict like this in our Rider Bet!)

And on closing – the temperature – and yes, gas prices (hearing reports) are going DOWN! The 5 letter word – FROST is even being mentioned for some areas. Come on – it's still August!! We hear that it was so cold at the Red Barn Market last Sunday that some people had to “dance” to keep warm.

Harvest Recipe

APPLE STREUSEL MUFFINS

2 cups flour
1 cup sugar
1 Tbsp baking powder
1¼ tsp cinnamon
½ tsp salt
½ tsp baking soda
2 large eggs
1 cup sour cream
¼ cup oil
1 cup finely diced apples

Topping:
¼ cup brown sugar
3 Tbsp flour
¼ tsp cinnamon
2 Tbsp butter



Combine all dry ingredients.
In large bowl, combine eggs, sour cream and oil.
Add all at once to dry ingredients.
Add apple and mix just enough to combine.
Put into muffin tins.
Sprinkle with topping.
Bake at 400° F 20 – 25 minutes.

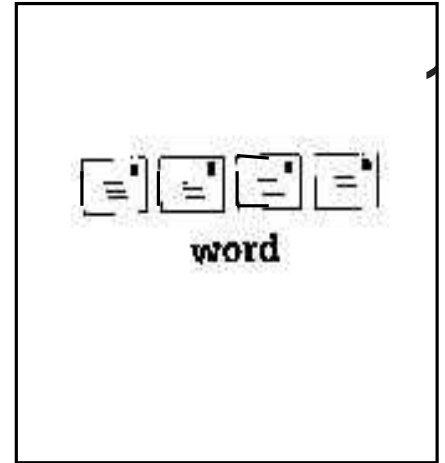
