DID YOU KNOW:

There have been: (M1.5 or greater)

- -- 90 earthquakes today (Wed. January 13th) -- 752 earthquakes in the past 7 days
- -- 3,212 earthquakes in the past month -- 38,958 earthquakes in the past year

We hear from the news reports that there have been several minor earthquakes along the coastline from California to British Columbia.

In Canada reports are that British Columbia has had (M1.5 or greater)

- -- 3 earthquakes today (Wed. Jan. 13th)
- -- 8 earthquakes in the past 7 days
- -- 30 earthquakes in the past month
- -- 409 earthquakes in the past year

At 11:27 am Tuesday Fox Creek Alberta experienced a 4.8 magnitude earthquake.

What about Saskatchewan? Do we experience earthquakes?

Reports state that Eastern Ontario and Quebec and the West Coast aren't the only parts of Canada that have an earthquake risk. Research shows that while the probability is quite low, Saskatchewan and Manitoba also have some risk of experiencing a large quake. There are some earthquakes in the middle of Canada and apparently we see earthquakes in Saskatchewan relatively often, maybe five times a year. We had a magnitude-5.3 earthquake in Saskatchewan in 1909. Anywhere in Canada earthquakes can apparently happen, however it is stated that the probabilities are low [in central Canada].





No words can express our love and gratitude to you Kevin , thank you, we love you very much!





CHEWY CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES



1 cup packed light brown sugar

¹/₃ cup white sugar

2 eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

 $1\frac{1}{2}$ cups all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon baking soda

½ teaspoon salt

3 cups quick-cooking oats

1 cup chopped walnuts (optional)

1 cup semi-sweet chocolate chips

1 ½ teaspoons ground cinnamon (optional)

TIP: for softer, chewy cookies, do not overbake. Also dough can be put in fridge for 1 hr before putting onto baking sheets.



Preheat the oven to 325°F.

In a large bowl, sift together flour, baking soda and salt. Set aside.

In another bowl, cream together butter, brown sugar and white sugar until smooth. Beat in eggs one at a time, then stir in vanilla.

Stir dry ingredients in the cream mixture until just blended. mix in quick oats, walnuts and chocolate chips.

Drop by heaping spoonfuls onto ungreased baking sheet. Bake for 13 minutes in the preheated oven. Allow cookies to cool on baking sheet for 5 minutes before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.


FLYERS' REPORT
