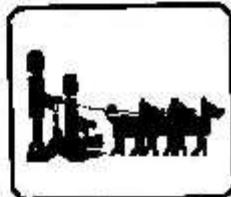

### FOOD PRICES RISING

Does it seem like food is costing more every time you make a trip to the grocery store? A study released last Thursday says you'd be right to think your grocery bill is rising — and you should expect more of the same throughout 2016. A research team at the University of Guelph Food Institute forecasts that food inflation rates are going to be 2 – 4% in 2016, much higher than the overall inflation rate as measured by Statistics Canada's consumer price index. That's after a year in which the cost of meat, vegetables, fruit and nuts jumped more than anticipated, pushing up your food bill by 4.1% in 2015. It is stated that Canada is the only industrialized country where you find the food inflation rate to be above 2.5% (That's significant as right now we are sitting at 4.1%).

Apparently the main reason is the value of the loonie, which continues to fall. With 81% of vegetables, fruit and nuts imported from outside of Canada, all of these grocery items are more expensive and are set to become even pricier if the loonie falls further. Another factor that could affect food prices is climate change. The drought in California has pushed up fruit and vegetable prices in 2015, but in 2016 a big El Nino should mean a lot of rain that will restore crops in the U.S. southwest and hopefully could help keep prices down. The cost of meat makes one want to become a vegetarian, but a comment overheard at the coffee shop was "if they won the lottery they could afford to buy a head of cauliflower".

As much as we complain about food prices increasing, it is noted that in Nunavut a bag of flour is reported to cost \$44 and a jug of orange juice would set you back more than \$26.
