2016 – 2017 SASKATCHEWAN LOTTERIES COMMUNITY GRANT PROGRAM

(Previously: TIP Grant)

Each year funding is available through Saskatchewan Lotteries, based on a per capita amount, for the population of the Town of Wawota plus allocations of populations from RM #92 and RM #93. The program is designed to provide funding for sport, culture and recreation programs and is administered through the Wawota Recreation Board.

The Rec. Board then disperses the money to local groups and clubs that have made application for funding for their eligible programs. The fast approaching deadline to apply for the 2016-2017 Community Grant is February 28, 2016 – **NO exceptions.**





Our Wawota 4-H Club (includes the horse project) are hosting a district Fun Bowling on February 27th - 2:00 - 4:30 in Moosomin. The Horse project has invited us to attend a talk from Erika Easton on February 26th at 7:00 pm at the Wawota Curling rink to learn what goes into a "great speech". We have set the date for speeches for March 5th at 1:00 at the school. This will include the horse project members. The top two speakers from each age category move on to District's to be held in Moosomin this year.

We will have our next General Meeting (with horse project) March 8th at 7:30 (curling rink). Our club plans on Attending the Yorkton Spring Steer and Heifer Show March 31st - April 2nd. We also set the date for Steak Supper for April 22.

At the end of our meeting we practiced giving injections to oranges using water that had been coloured. Super Bowl Recipe

BUFFALO CHICKEN SLIDERS

Yields: 12 sliders

3/4 cup butter

3/4 cup hot sauce

- 3 Tbsp. white vinegar
- 2 Tbsp. Worcestershire
- 2 tsp garlic powder
- 4 chicken breasts
- 1 package of 12 Rolls
- 1 bunch of green leaf lettuce
- 2 cups coles law veggie mix (thinly sliced cabbage and carrots)
- 1 1/2 cups blue cheese dressing (or ranch dressing)
- 1 small package blue cheese crumbles (optional)

Directions:

Combine the butter, hot sauce, white vinegar, Worcestershire, and garlic powder to create your buffalo sauce (or substitute with two cups of premade buffalo sauce). Place four chicken breasts in your slow cooker and cover with the sauce. Cook on high heat for four hours.

When the chicken has finished cooking, shred the chicken breasts with two forks. On the side, mix together the coleslaw veggie mix and blue cheese or ranch dressing. To assemble your sliders, layer the Rolls, green leaf lettuce, buffalo chicken, blue cheese/ranch coleslaw, and blue cheese crumbles. Serve, and enjoy!

DID YOU KNOW ...

The first curling bonspiel in Canada was played on the Don River in Toronto on February 12, 1839.

The first Canadian curling club was established in Montreal in 1807.

Common Terms (for those who never watched curling!):

"Blank End" – an end that is scoreless.

"Button" - The innermost circle surrounding the tee. The button is usually one foot in diameter.

"Double" - Removing two stones from play with one shot.

"Clean" – stay with the rock and be ready to sweep"

"Hurry Hard" – sweep as hard as possible.
