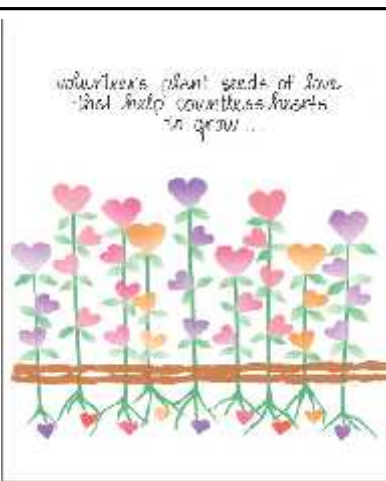

CRANBERRY CHICKEN

1 cup cranberry sauce	1½ tsp salt
1 tbsp chicken bullion	

Place onion in slow cooker. Arrange chicken over onion. Combine remaining ingredients and spoon over chicken. Cover and cook on low for 6 – 8 hours – or high 3 – 4 hours. Serve with rice.

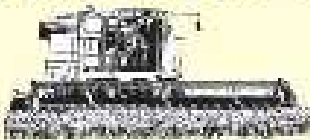

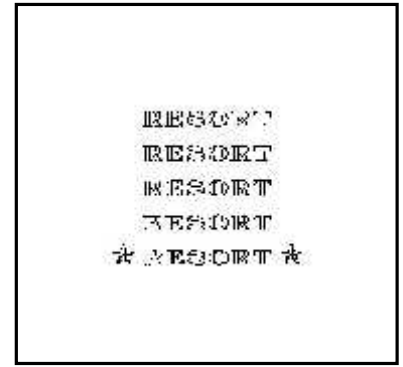
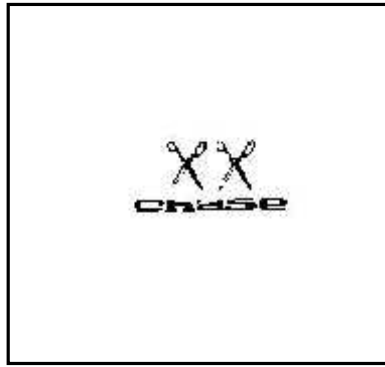
