ROBERT BURNS DAY – JANUARY 25, 2017

Robert "Robbie" Burns was born on January 25, 1759 into the family of a peasant farmer in southwest Scotland. Burns himself took up farming at a young age and having no success; he began writing poems for local circulation. Soon, he had them published in a book in the small town of Kilmarnock. Copies of the Kilmarnock edition reached Edinburgh and the intellectuals there were impressed right away. Most of Burn's poems were short, lyrical pieces but they became an instant hit. His life lasted for less than 40 years, but his "Auld Lang Syne" has survived for 250 years and will continue to survive.



In Scotland, Robert Burns Day is always celebrated on the 25th day of January each year – in remembrance of his birthdate in 1759. This special day is often also celebrated in Canada, Australia and America, especially by those of Scottish ancestry.

Traditionally on this day, women wear shawls, dresses or skirts and the men wear kilts. All clothing worn in celebration of this day is made from family tartan. At gatherings such as this, toasts are often made with whiskey, the traditional drink of the event. Literary pieces by Robert Burns are recited until a man marches into the dining room playing a bagpipe. Behind him comes another man, elegantly carrying the haggis on a tray and a recital of the "Address to a Haggis" follows. It is written that other foods served at this celebration are: Neeps (mashed turnips); Tatties (mashed potatoes); Cock-a-Leekie Soup (soup of chicken and leeks); Cranachan (whipped cream with raspberry served with sweet oat wafers) and Bannocks or bread cooked on a griddle.

In case you would like the recipe for Haggis...here it is:

It is made from the heart, liver and lungs of a sheep. These organs are finely chopped and mixed with toasted oatmeal, onions, and seasonings. Then everything is boiled in a bag made from the sheep's stomach. We are told Haggis tastes slightly like hash. Enjoy!!

Robert Burns is most admired for having spoken the manner of the common person and for his native lyrical understanding. It is said his poems celebrate the natural love between a man and woman, the enjoyment of sociable drinking and the pride of the self-reliant man and woman.

ATTENTION CITIZENS OF WAWOTA:

The Council of the R.M. OF WALPOLE NO. 92 are very concerned about the low numbers of ambulance personnel currently operating the Wawota Ambulance Service and the fact that there is no one stepping up to help out!

Did you know that the ambulance service no longer runs 24/7?

There are fewer and fewer number of qualified personnel to cover all ambulance shifts throughout Wawota and the surrounding area. There is an average wait time of 35 minutes for an ambulance to come from another community to respond to an emergency in our community!

Did you know that personnel do indeed receive remuneration for being a "Community Ambulance Attendant &/or Driver"?

Ambulance personnel are members of CUPE and are a part of a negotiated contract along with other Saskatchewan Health Region (S.H.R.) employees. Personnel receive \$5.00/hour for every hour on standby. If you are called out for any reason, personnel are then paid approximately \$21,000+ per hour for several days out on for at least a minimum of 3 hours.

Have you heard rumors that SCIR does not pay for all the expenses paid out in order to get certified?

SCIR pays for a great portion of the expense to get certified once you have completed the EMB course, the EMB college of Anatomical and successfully been hired by SCIR (we'll also need Criminal Check, Work Reference and Minimum Class 2 Drivers License). You must pay for all expenses up front that will be reimbursed by SCIR.

In an effort to assist with recruitment of ambulance staff for Wawota & District, the Council of the R.M. Walpole are proposing to pay for all the expenses incurred for you to become an Emergency Medical Responder (EMR). Fees will be paid on your behalf up front with no repayment schedule required.

IF YOU ARE INTERESTED in becoming certified and helping out on YOUR ambulance – please contact the R.M. of Walpole office @: 306-739-2545 at your very earliest convenience.

Any time you can give to be on ambulances is more time that Wawota is covered!

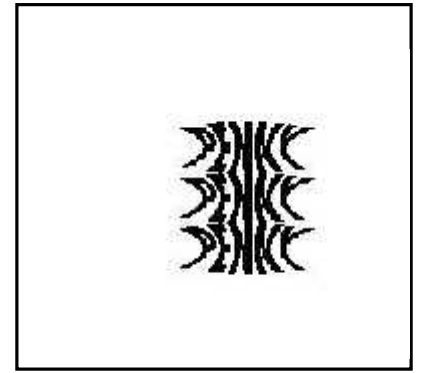
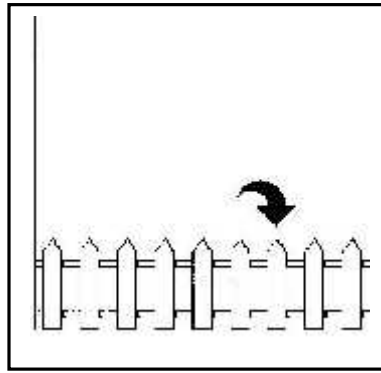
