CHEERS TO THE NEW YEAR ...

When is Chinese New Year, which animal is it for 2017 and what is a fire rooster?

Unlike our festivities, which always take place at midnight between December 31 and January 1, Chinese New Year is a movable celebration. The 2017 Chinese New Year begins on January 28. Chinese New Year takes place on a different date each year because it is based on the lunar calendar.

The celebrations will start on January 27, New Year's Eve, and continue for around two weeks - ending on February 2 – and the year will last until February 15, 2018. Celebrations are an explosion of light and sound - involving bell ringing, lighting firecrackers, and watching traditional lion dances. Chinese families gather together for a reunion dinner on New Year's Eve. The Chinese believe that as they enter a new year, they should start a new beginning. They clean their houses to sweep away bad fortune, pay off all of their debts, purchase new clothes, paint their doors, and even get new haircuts in order to have a fresh start for the new year. Traditionally, kids would be given red envelopes stuffed with 'lucky money' and positive wishes on New Year's Day.

This year is the Year of the Rooster. The Chinese zodiac moves in a 12-year cycle, and those born in 1945, 1957, 1969, 1981, 1993 and 2005 are also known as Roosters.

What is a fire rooster? Not all Roosters are equal - there are five different types, each with different characteristics. This is the year of the Fire Rooster, which last fell in 1957. Fire Roosters are known for being trustworthy, punctual and responsible (especially at work). The other types are Wood Roosters, Earth Roosters, Gold Roosters and Water Roosters.



On the whole, Roosters are active, amusing, popular, healthy, outspoken, honest, loyal, talkative and charming. They are also known to enjoy the spotlight - but can be vain and boastful. Luckiest things for Roosters: Numbers 5, 7 & 8; the 4th and 26th days of the Chinese lunar month; gold, brown & yellow colors; gladiola and cockscomb flowers; south & south-east directions; and the 2nd, 5th and 11th Chinese lunar months. Things Roosters should avoid: the color red; the numbers 1, 3 & 9; east direction; and the 3rd, 9th & 12th Chinese lunar months.

The dragon is a very popular symbol for the Chinese New Year. It is a symbol of strength and good luck. A Chinese New Year 2017 celebration would not be complete without a giant dragon parading down the street. The dragon costume is always very colorful and can be up to 100 feet long. People inside the costume make the dragon move up and down as it zigzags past the spectators.

GROUNDHOG DAY – FEB. 2ND

Many take the time to observe Groundhog Day on February 2 each year. Groundhog Day in Canada focuses on the concept of a groundhog coming out of its home in mid-winter to “predict” if spring is on its way in the northern hemisphere. If he sees his shadow, 6 more weeks of winter ... no shadow, spring is on its way.

Many Canadians celebrate Groundhog Day by attending festivals, engaging in activities and reading or listening to news about groundhog appearances on February 2.

The Groundhog Day concept became popular in Canada in 1956 when Warton Willie became a household name for his early February “weather predictions”. Warton’s Groundhog Day festival grew as Willie’s fame increased. It became one of the largest winter festivals in Bruce County, Canada.

There are also other groundhogs in different parts of Canada. For example, Schubencadie Sam is reportedly the first groundhog in the country to stick its head out on Groundhog Day. Other groundhogs include: Gary the Groundhog in Ontario, Brandon Bob in Manitoba and Balzac Billy in Alberta.

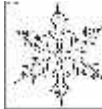

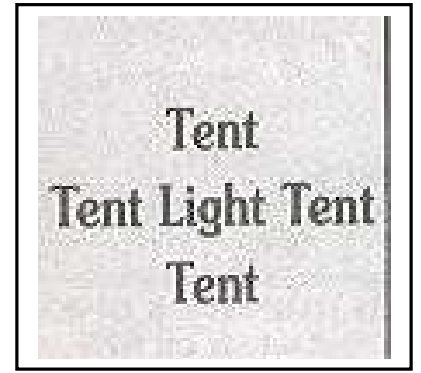
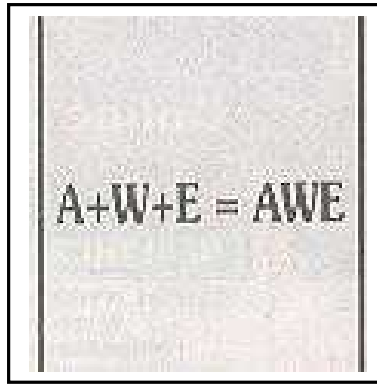
