The History of Mother's Day

Celebrating motherhood is a historical tradition dating back almost as far as mothers themselves. A number of ancient cultures paid tribute to mothers as goddesses, including the ancient Greeks, who celebrated Rhea, the mother of all gods. The ancient Romans also honored their mother goddess, Cybele, and the Celtic Pagans marked the coming of spring with a fertility celebration linking their goddess Brigid together with the first milk of the ewes.

During the 17th century, those living on the British Isles initiated a religious celebration of motherhood, called Mothering Sunday, which was held on the fourth Sunday during the Lenten season. This holiday featured the reunification of mothers and their children, separated when working class families had to send off their young children to be employed as house servants. On Mothering Sunday, the child servants were allowed to return home for the day to visit with their parents.

In the USA in 1858, Anna Reeves Jarvis was the first woman to hold an official celebration of mothers. Meanwhile Julia Ward Howe, author of the "Battle Hymn of the Republic," in 1872, initiated and promoted a Mother's Day for Peace, to be held on June 2. Then in 1905, Anna Reeves Jarvis passed away and her daughter, Anna Jarvis, took up her mother's torch. Anna swore on her mother's gravesite that she would realize her lifelong dream of creating a national day to honor mothers. In 1909, Anna left her job and dedicated herself to a full-time letter-writing campaign, imploring politicians, clergymen and civic leaders to institute a national day for mothers. In 1912, Jarvis' efforts met with success: Her home state of West Virginia adopted an official Mother's Day; two years later, the U.S. Congress passed a Joint Resolution, signed by President Wilson, establishing a national Mother's Day emphasizing the role of women in their families.

Today the festival of Mother's Day is celebrated across 46 countries (though on different dates) and is a hugely popular affair. In USA and Canada, Mother's Day is celebrated on the second Sunday of May. Millions of people across the globe take the day as an opportunity to honor their mothers, thank them for their efforts in giving them life, raising them and being their constant support. Carnations are a popular Mother's Day symbol in both Canada and the United States. Some people may choose to wear a carnation as a brooch on Mother's Day. However, other flowers are also given to mothers or mother figures to symbolize one's love and appreciation for them.

How things change – last year at this time, all eyes were on the fires at Fort McMurray, AB and the devastation being caused. One year later, major flooding is happening in Ontario and Quebec. **CELEBRATING CANADA'S 150TH
BY REMEMBERING OUR PAST**

As early as 1910 Fernley district has a baseball team. Later (the "earlier") Tom Weatherald coached a team consisting of: Lyle Weatherald, Norman Dallas, Sandy Dallas, Carson Kerr, Connie Weatherald, Herb Weatherald, Charlie McQueen, Jimmy Milton and Norman Oliver. This team was known as the "Hungry Nine". Their first suits were made by the mothers and sisters of the players. They played on the picnic grounds located on Tom Weatherald's farm. Later, Lyle who pitched for the Hungry Nine, coached the Wawota Pats.

By 1925 some of these players played as a Wawota team with Tom Weatherald as their coach. They were: Norman Dallas (catcher), Fred Greenbank (1st), Carson Kerr (2nd), Norman Oliver (3rd), Bert Rowbotham (short), Doc Clements (left field), Leeson Clements (centre field), Sandy Dallas (right field), and Lyle Weatherald (pitcher).

Wawota Pats Baseball Team 2017

The Saskatchewan Baseball Hall of Fame and Museum Association is proud to announce the selection of the Wawota Pats Baseball Team to be inducted into the Saskatchewan Baseball Hall of Fame, Team Category, Saturday, August 19, 2017, at Battleford, Saskatchewan.

The community of Wawota has had senior level baseball since 1915 with the exception of the war years. The team had many players over the years with their most successful years found competing in many tournaments in three different senior leagues. Often the team would play in two tournaments a week, usually in Southeast Saskatchewan and Western Manitoba. Their best season showed a record of winning 44 games with 6 losses. At one point they won 5 consecutive tournaments.

The Wawota Pats Baseball Team was formed in 1951 and has played continuously until the present time. Currently they play in a nine team Southeast Senior League.

The Late Lyle Weatherald who was the first coach of the Pats, continued coaching the team for the next 20 years. The first players were Bantam and Midget age but competed in the senior category. For the past 65 years the Pats have competed in Saskatchewan Manitoba and North Dakota, being one of the most competitive teams for the majority of these years.

The Wawota Pats were the 1970 Saskatchewan Provincial Champions, at a time when all senior teams competed in one category, with the exception of the Northern and Southern Saskatchewan Leagues that hired players. Baseball at that time drew big crowds with one tournament in the small community of Bellegarde drawing 23 senior teams playing on 3 baseball diamonds. The Pats were in the final game with the game having to be called for darkness in a 0-0 tie!

During the years 1952 to 2015, Pats players and players from a second Wawota senior team combined to make a team that competed for Wawota. Their successes included the Wawota Pats winning the 1970 Saskatchewan Provincial Senior Championship; the Wawota Cardinals winning the 1972 Saskatchewan Intermediate Championship; the 1995 Provincial Senior AA Championship and the Western Canadian Silver Medal, and in 2005, the Pats were the Saskatchewan Senior A Champions.

Several members of the Wawota Pats have also played on Wawota Twilite baseball teams at the Mini, Maxi and the Masters tournaments winning several provincial titles.




