**Did You Know ...** Wawota's first Heritage Weekend was held in 1985. The theme adopted was: Honouring the Past; Saluting the Present; Building the Future. Last year a Ranch Rodeo was added and the main venue moved to the Valley. Over the years, Wawota has had many summer celebrations (as stated in the Wawota History Book "A Flight Through Time"): 1927 Jubilee Celebration (Diamond Jubilee of Canada); 1955 Wawota's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary; 1967 Centennial Days; 1971 Wawota Homecoming; 1976 "Hardtop Hoedown"; 1980 Saskatchewan & Wawota's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary; and 1985 – Wawota's Heritage Festival. (I am sure we missed some of them.)

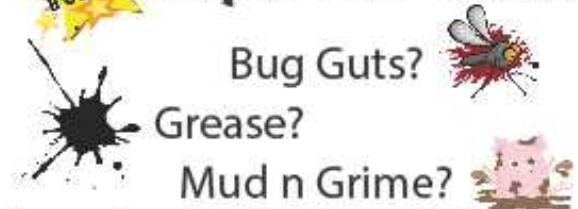

## CELEBRATING CANADA'S 150<sup>TH</sup>

### SOME MORE MUSIC HISTORY

**Nov. 5, 1984** – Vancouver's Bryan Adams released 'Reckless' – the first Canadian album to top a million sales on home soil.

**Dec. 1984** – Leonard Cohen released his single 'Hallelujah'.

**Nov. 4, 1985** – Edmonton's musician k.d. lang won the Juno for most promising female vocalist.

**Oct. 24, 1986** – Drake, born in Toronto, had the most charted songs by a solo artist in Billboard Top 100 history.

**1992** – The Ottawa Senators begins to play Stompin' Tom's 'The Hockey Song' (released in 1973). Soon other rinks followed.

**Dec. 5, 1996** – Wilf Carter died in Scottsdale, Ariz. at the age of 91.

**Nov. 4, 1997** – 'Come On Over' released by Shania Twain (Timmons, ON) was the bestselling country album, studio album by a woman & album by a Canadian of all time.

**Feb. 24, 1999** – Celine Dion was the first Canadian to win the record-of-the-year Grammy for 'My Heart Will Go On' and it also won an Oscar for its use in the movie 'Titanic'.

**Dec. 20, 1999** – Hank Snow died of heart failure at the age of 85.

**June 1, 2003** – The TV Show "Canadian Idol" debuted. One winner was Jacob Hoggard (2004) who became famous as the band "Headley".

**June 12, 2004** – Terri Clark (Medicine Hat, AB) became a member of the Grand Ole Opry.

**Sept. 24, 2007** – The TV Show "Big Bang Theory" debuted with its theme song by Canadian "Barenaked Ladies".

**Feb. 10, 2008** – Justin Bieber (Stratford, ON) appeared on YouTube, singing Chris Brown's 'With You' – discovery awaited.

**Oct. 9, 2009** – Michael Buble (Burnaby, BC) performed his new single 'Haven't Met You Yet' on TV show "Oprah".

**Feb. 27, 2010** – "I Believe" by Nikki Yanofsky (Montreal) topped the Canadian Hot 100 chart and was used to promote two Olympic Games.

**Sept. 20, 2011** – Carly Rae Jepsen, born in Mission, BC, released 'Call Me Maybe' and it became the worldwide bestselling single in 2012.

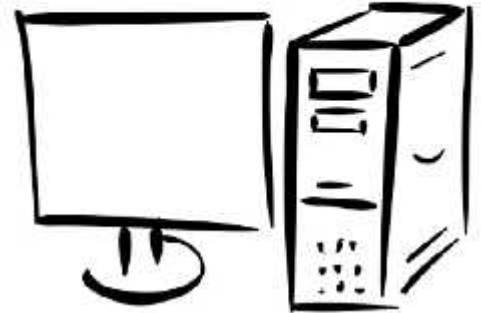
