OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOE BOX PROJECT

School Supplies: exercise books or note books; pencils, pens, crayons, erasers, pencil sharpeners, calculators, pencil cases.

Hygiene: Toothbrushes, combs, tissues, sanitary pads, unscented soap, face cloths or small towel.

Play: skipping ropes, balls, stuffed animals, cars, trucks, balloons, tops, marbles, small dominos, harmonica or other instruments, stickers, frisbees, sewing kits.

Clothing: flip flops, hats, t-shirts, toques, sox, scarves, underwear (new), shorts, dresses, ball caps.

PUCK DROP FROM THE WAWOTA FORUM ...



The Wawota Forum held their AGM Sept 20th and it looks like it will be an action-packed year for the Rink! Leanne reviewed previous meeting minutes and then the Treasurer's Report was given. Last year the rink had total income of \$132,675 and total Expenses of \$144,267 for a LOSS of \$11,591. This loss means more fundraising activities are required (See below).

The Election for executive and board members took place. Your **Executive for the 2017/18 Year is:**

President: Rob West

Vice-President: Kevin Kay

Treasurer: Shanna Pushka

Secretary: Vacant. Leanne Porter stepped down after numerous terms—this position needs to be filled!

Kitchen Coordinator: Shawna Cudmore

Board Members: Todd Wilson, Shawna Cudmore, Wendi McCarthy, Susan Wilson, Leanne Porter and Samantha Greenbank

Old Business: the debate of mesh surrounding the playing surface versus putting in higher plexiglass continues! A motion was passed that the Flyers would donate \$5000 towards the purchase of higher plexiglass to help protect our spectators in the stands. Other old business touched on renewing Advertising surrounding the playing surface, which will occur every 3 years, and there are some new businesses that want to put up signs.

New Business:

- **-New Lights!** Thanks to the Lions for the funding to upgrade the old lights over the ice surface to new LED lights. It is expected that this will help cut power consumption—and they are much brighter.
- **-Fundraising:** The rink is a costly facility to operate and so there are several fundraising activities lined up for the year to try and keep operating in the Black.
 - Cash Lotto: this will be a new spin on tickets sales instead of the TV that has been raffled off in previous years. Tickets are \$100 each, but the Jackpot will be \$10,000 to be drawn New Year's Eve (at our New Year's Eve Dance—also a fundraiser!) and there will be on-going weekly draws of \$100 for 52 weeks.
 - Sportsman's Supper: this was our big Saturday, Oct 7th. All proceeds will go towards the Rink Addition
 - Chase the Ace: Kevin Kay is working on Wawota having our own Chase the Ace, stay tuned for details
- **Operating Business:**
 - -Work bee to get the rink cleaned happened Oct 1st and Oct 2nd
 - -Hockey School: Shawna is looking to confirm dates, but will be the week-ends of Oct 21st & 22nd and the 28th & 29th.
 - -Goalie Clinic: we are also looking at having a clinic with the Virden Oil Caps, similar to last year.
 - -Caretaker: still no applications to date
 - -Rink scheduling: Rob will call a meeting in the next couple weeks to discuss the rink schedule before the League Scheduling Meeting. Note that Minor Hockey day will be Dec 9th this year.
