TOWN COUNCIL MINUTES ...

- Visitors at the meeting were Hector Lamontagne (RM Wawken) and Staff Sergeant Simons (Carlyle RMCP)
- Discussion re replacement value for insurance purposes of the Forum, Curling Rink, Town Hall and Municipal Building/Firehall.
- Discussion of RCMP staffing shortages, open cases regarding Wawota and the 3rd quarter report.
- That \$500 Wawota Bucks be purchased from the Wawota Business Enhancement Group and donated as prizes for Wawota Business Customer Appreciation on Dec. 1, 2017 and that the Bucks be split into three prizes of \$100 and one \$300, and that pictures of the town be sent to the planning committee to use in their power point presentation.
- That the Town approve including the Forum's Caretaker under the Town's Sask. Worker's Compensation Board policy and arrangements for payment to the caretaker.
- That Gene Luscombe be hired for sidewalk snow removal from Nov. 1/17 to May 31/18.
- That the Town hold their Year End Party on Friday, January 5, 2018 at the Wawota Village Inn and prime rib be purchased from Moose Mountain Meats.
- That the Town adopt Bylaw No. 19/2017 re Authorizing certain expenditures.
- That the Town adopt Bylaw No. 20/2017 re Repealing certain bylaws.
- That approval be given to set hours for future water main flushing to start not earlier than 8:00 p.m.
- That the Town pay 1/3 of annual 2018 EMS fee for each of the EMR attendants with the two RMs each paying their 1/3 share and each EMR will be reimbursed in full upon proof of them having paid the College of Paramedics Annual Fee.
- That the Town accept MNP's Audit Service Plan and Engagement letter for the 2017 Audit & Financial Statements.
- That the Town approve to sign a lease for the Corner Building (401 Railway Ave.) with Ivy & Elm Flower Boutique for the period Dec. 1/17 to Nov. 30/18.
- That the Town approve Christmas and New Year's holiday office hours.

HOW COLD WAS IT ??

In late December 2017, most of the country was colder than Antarctica, where the temperature hovered at a downright enjoyable -16 C at the Amundsen-Scott Weather Station. St. John's, N.L. was one of the only exceptions at around -5 C. To be fair, though the South Pole is generally considered to be colder than the North Pole, it's currently summer in the Southern Hemisphere. Too bad much of Canada was also colder than the North Pole, where the average temperature that week was around -23 C. That was about 6 degrees warmer than it was in Saskatoon and several other places.

The Gale Crater on Mars clocked in at -23 C on Dec. 28, which makes the red planet around the same as temperatures were in Toronto, Montreal, Winnipeg, and Calgary which were all somewhere between -19 and -24 C.

Greetings and Happy New Year (Year of the Dog) - surprising how smart this California sun makes you!

Weather was perfect for travel - signs of snow 'til we reached Kansas, then anything white along the road after that was cotton! Had a day of rain on the 9th - snow in the upper levels of the mountains - as the temps are mid 70's to low 80 (F of course) each day the snow recedes. (The day of the rain caused the "pool-goers" to have second think!).

We're not in the area of the fire or mud slides - rain measured 1.36 " - the normal season is usually about 5". "Watch for Flooding" signs were obvious on several streets/roadways.

Soaking up the rays, sightseeing, shopping, golfing, "trying our luck" & socializing pretty well sums up our agenda - Oh Yes - and eating fresh oranges & grapefruit.

"Til next week, keep warm folks - we're thinking of you as we wipe away the sweat!

P.S. Forgot to mention - we anxiously listen to the Flyer's broadcast games - wagering is "legal" here, so some \$\$\$ have changed hands - so far only to the "visitors".

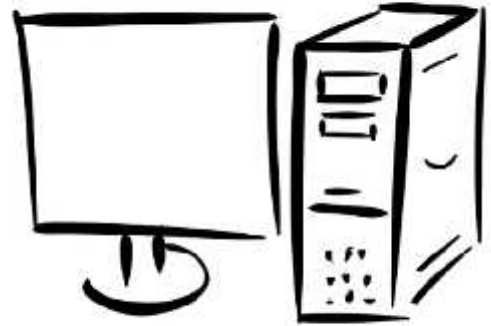

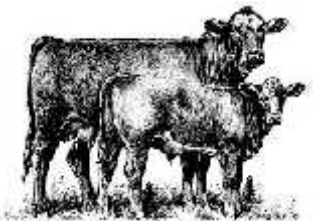
