GROUNDHOG DAY – FEB. 2ND

Today Groundhog Day is celebrated in many parts of Canada focusing on the concept of a groundhog coming out of its home in mid-winter to “predict” if spring is on its way in the northern hemisphere. What did he do today? Did he see his shadow and pop back into his burrow predicting 6 more weeks of winter or was there no shadow and spring is on its way.



The Groundhog Day concept became popular in Canada in 1956 when Warton Willie became a household name for his early February “weather predictions”. Warton’s Groundhog Day festival grew as Willie’s fame increased. It became one of the largest winter festivals in Bruce County, Canada. There are also other groundhogs in different parts of Canada. For example, Schubencadie Sam is reportedly the first groundhog in the country to stick its head out on Groundhog Day. Other groundhogs include: Gary the Groundhog in Ontario, Brandon Bob in Manitoba and Balzac Billy in Alberta.

WANDERING THOUGHTS

(as we see them)

Shall we start off our thoughts/comments about the weather again? Cold/warmer/rain/fog/wind – you name it, we are getting it!! After some much cooler temps we thought we were going to have a “balmier” (for January) day on Tuesday. But we had some ice pellets, some rain and a cold wind with gusts up to 80 km/hr. And back into colder weather for the rest of the week and beyond. Makes for interesting driving/walking conditions, and confusion as to what clothes to wear each day!

Today, February 2nd we will find out what the groundhog has to say about whether we will get 6 more weeks of winter or if we can expect an early spring. We guess that it depends on which groundhog you believe or what area of the country he is from – predictions seems to vary. We have had unusual weather this winter so far, thus who knows what the next few months will bring.

If the clouds stayed away and the skies were clear, did you check out the moon on January 30/31? Sources tell us the Moon was in a Waxing Gibbous phase. This phase is when the moon is more than 50% illuminated but not yet a Full Moon. The phase lasts around 7 days with the moon becoming more illuminated each day until the Full Moon. In some parts of the world, lucky sky-watchers got a cosmic three-for-one deal, as the second super-size full moon in a month underwent a dramatic total lunar eclipse on the morning of January 31. According to eclipse experts, “the event marked the first time anyone on Earth had seen this celestial event in 35 years—and the first time it had been seen in the Americas in 150 years. On the 31st, the moon officially reached its full phase at 7:27 a.m. CT. This was the second full moon to occur in a calendar month, an event commonly referred to as a ‘blue moon’. Around the same time, the full moon made an especially close approach to Earth, a phenomenon popularly called a ‘supermoon’. Adding to the space oddity, viewers in some parts of the world also saw a total lunar eclipse on the 31st. When the eclipse hits its peak, the moon’s face can sometimes take on a reddish tone, earning it the moniker of ‘blood moon’.”



In the area of politics, we see the end of the “Brad Wall era” and the naming of the new leader of the Sask Party and now Saskatchewan’s Premier, Scott Moe. And on the USA scene, President Trump gave his first “State of the Union” address. Makes for interesting?? times.

We are sure many who enjoy playing, or just watching, curling on TV have been enjoying the Scotties Tournament of Hearts this week. Now comes the weekend when many will retire to a comfortable couch or chair with “munchies” and “refreshments” close by -- to watch the American Super Bowl. Wagers, we are sure, will be made – Eagles or Patriots??

And lastly, this weekend we will be welcoming our “Holidayayers” back to Saskatchewan, and we did make sure the colder weather would be greeting them!!



SUPER BOWL RECIPES

Broccomole' Dip

(This is like guacamole, without avocados)
2 cups chopped fresh broccoli, cooked & chilled
¼ cup sour cream
1 – 2 Tbsp minced onion
1 Tbsp mayonnaise
2 – 3 Tbsp lemon juice
¼ - ½ tsp chili powder

In food processor or blender, combine all ingredients, and blend until smooth.
Refrigerate for several hours.
Serve with fresh veggies or baked tortilla chips.

Oven Crisp Chicken Wings

1/3 cup flour
1 Tbsp paprika
1 tsp garlic salt
1 tsp pepper
¼ - ½ tsp cayenne pepper
3 Tbsp butter
10-12 Chicken Wings, tips removed

Cut wings at joints. Preheat oven to 425°F. Make sure wings are dried (with paper towels).
Combine all dry ingredients in plastic bag, shake to mix. Add wings. Cover large baking sheet with foil and melt butter on it. Place wings on pan and turn to coat. Bake 30 min. Turn wings over, bake another 15 min. until crispy or done.



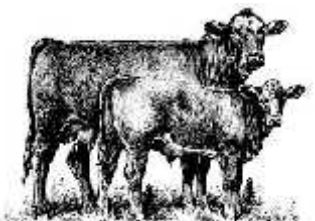

Problems with Lack of Snow ...

Parts of the Sahara Desert received rare snowfall in January, with up to 40 centimetres falling in the Algerian desert town of Ain Sefra. That freak snow — only the third time in 40 years — made for some fantastic photographs before melting but would be more welcome in Western Canada, where many areas have now seen less moisture than an actual desert this winter. Snow cover maps of the three prairie provinces show a large section of central Saskatchewan with virtually no snow, while levels elsewhere are generally well below average for this time of year. Agriculture Canada states that soil moisture at the time of freeze-up was poor throughout much of the southern Prairies. Without snow cover, soils are exposed to increased moisture loss. The significant concern at this time with low snow pack is that water supplies will not recharge unless we get significant late winter snow."

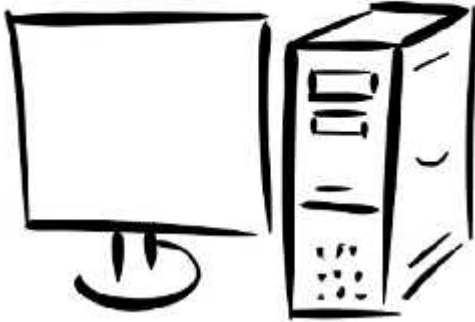
