St Patrick's Day is a global celebration of Irish culture on or around March 17. It particularly remembers St. Patrick, one of Ireland's patron saints, who ministered Christianity in Ireland during the fifth century. He is said to have died on March 17 in or around the year 493. He grew up in Roman Britain, but was captured by Irish raiders and taken to Ireland as a slave when he was a young adult. After some years he returned to his family and entered the church, like his father and grandfather before him. He later returned to Ireland as a missionary and worked in the north and west of the country. He is said to be buried under Down Cathedral in Downpatrick, Ireland.

The most common St Patrick's Day symbol is the shamrock. Other Irish-related symbols seen on St Patrick's Day include the harp, which was used in Ireland for centuries, as well as a mythological creature known as the leprechaun and a pot of gold that the leprechaun keeps hidden.

## WANDERING THOUGHTS

(as we see them)

Well, has the “dig-out” been completed or are you still working at it? One thing for sure – the winter storm of 2018 will go down in the history books – an International Collision When an Alberta front and a Colorado low met!

As we explored around Town, we see overhangs of snow on some buildings up to three feet long – and icicles reaching from roof to ground – and some horizontal instead of vertical?? We can be thankful (we suppose) that the second snowfall wasn't as wet and heavy as the first to fall – avoiding more problems.



We hung a sunflower seed filled bird feeder out before the storm – the day after we noticed tracks in the snow coming from the Valley – and upon examining, the feeder was empty! The deer must have been thinking “what a nice guy – putting out a self-feeder, sparing us from having to dig to find food”.

More on the storm. When we managed to get dug out, we met a vehicle on one of our streets – the driver had not cleaned the snow (several inches to a foot deep) from the top of their truck. As they were meeting us, the snow suddenly slid down onto the windshield completely obstructing all vision – how dangerous was that?! Had this happened in heavy traffic, it could have been serious. (We witnessed a similar occurrence while in a neighbouring centre two days later.)

With the many negative aspects of the storm and its spinoff, there are some positive points. Those owning snow machines welcomed the new conditions – as do the machine dealers. They say it could be a short season, but better than none at all. Most of all, those involved in agriculture are having a different outlook on the spring season than a couple of weeks ago.

And are we to see more history to be made when (and if) the leaders of North Korea and the United States meet in hopes of resolving world issues? Many say they'll only believe it when it actually happens – wait and see!

We saw a “first” at Chaos on Main in Maryfield – an Easter Tree! It is a white artificial tree decorated with many colourful Easter eggs. As a promotion, each egg contains a prize – free coffee, 10% off meal, free dessert, etc. for customers – what a unique idea! Management tells us that the same idea will be used for Mother's Day with the tree being decorated with roses!

## IRISH BEEF STEW RECIPE

1 1/4 pounds well-marbled chuck beef stew meat,  
cut into 1 1/2-inch chunks  
3 teaspoons of salt (more to taste)  
1/4 cup olive oil  
6 large garlic cloves, minced  
4 cups beef stock or broth  
2 cups water  
1 cup of Guinness extra stout  
1 cup of hearty red wine  
2 Tbsp tomato paste  
1 Tbsp sugar  
1 Tbsp dried thyme  
1 Tbsp Worcestershire sauce  
2 bay leaves  
2 Tbsp butter  
3 lbs potatoes, peeled & cut into 1/2 “ pieces

1 large onion, chopped (1 1/2 to 2 cups)  
2 cups 1/2-inch pieces peeled carrots and/or parsnips  
1/2 tsp black pepper & 1 – 2 tsp salt (to taste)  
2 Tbsp. chopped fresh parsley



Sprinkle salt on Beef and brown in olive oil in large skillet or heavy pot on med. high heat. Add garlic and saute. Add beef stock, water, stout, wine, tomato paste, sugar, thyme, Worcestershire sauce & bay leaves. Stir, bring to simmer and cook on low heat for one hour, stirring occasionally.

Melt butter in another pot and add onion, carrots, parsnips and saute about 15 minutes. When stew has cooked the one hour, add onion, carrots, parsnips, potatoes, pepper and salt to taste. Simmer uncovered about 40 minutes. Discard bay leaves. Drain off extra fat. Thicken with flour if you like thick gravy. Serve in bowls, sprinkle with parsley.

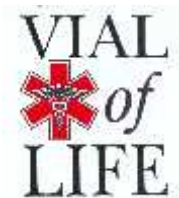

**VIAL OF LIFE ?**

Vial of Life is a program that helps emergency personnel locate important medical details in the event of an emergency in the home. A vial containing all important medical information is stored in the refrigerator and a sticker on the fridge door alerts emergency personnel that the vial is inside. (Why the refrigerator? – They are common to every household and can be easily located in an emergency.)

The aim of the Vial of Life program is to help paramedics on the scene of an emergency by reducing the amount of time searching for basic medical and prescription information. Having this information easily accessible will also save time for emergency room and hospital personnel and facilitate the care process. In addition, seniors living alone may not have someone to help communicate important health information to emergency personnel. Someone (doctor, pharmacist, caregiver) could help in the filling out of the form re medications, allergies, doctor's name, next of kin, life support wishes, etc. It is very important the information is kept up to date.

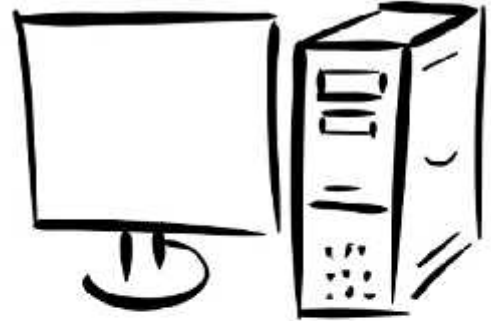

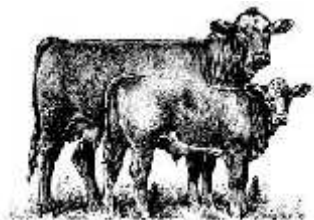

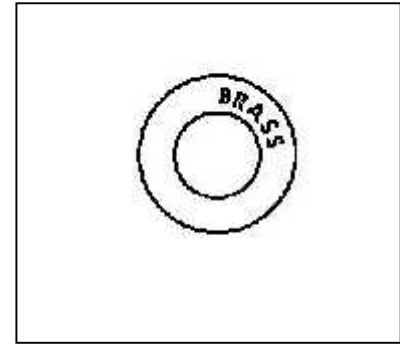
