



VIAL OF LIFE?

Vial of Life is a program that helps emergency personnel locate important medical details in the event of an emergency in the home. A vial containing all important medical information is stored in the refrigerator and a sticker on the fridge door alerts emergency personnel that the vial is inside. (Why the refrigerator? – They are common to every household and can be easily located in an emergency.)



The aim of the Vial of Life program is to help paramedics on the scene of an emergency by reducing the amount of time searching for basic medical and prescription information. Having this information easily accessible will also save time for emergency room and hospital personnel and facilitate the care process. In addition, seniors living alone may not have someone to help communicate important health information to emergency personnel. Someone (doctor, pharmacist, caregiver) could help in the filling out of the form re medications, allergies, doctor's name, next of kin, life support wishes, etc. It is very important the information is kept up to date.



The first day of **spring** arrived on Tuesday, March 20 this year. March is a notoriously fickle month for weather, but one thing that always comes, rain or shine, is the first day of spring — even if it doesn't feel like it.



The first day of spring is called the vernal equinox (sometimes also referred to as the spring equinox or March equinox) and it is almost always either March 20 or March 21 (though it will fall on March 20 for the next two years in a row). The date is determined when the sun passes over the plane of the earth's equator, making night and day approximately equal lengths all over the world.






