Well, here we are back to a normal week – whatever that is! The one thing we know for sure is that there will be seven days – what each brings is anyone's guess! Isn't it a good thing that we don't know what lies ahead?

How have you handled the past several days of heat and smoke haze? With temps reaching onor-about the 40°C mark and not cooling some nights to less than 20°, there isn't much time to cool! Remembering back when we were on the farm (40 years ago plus), stacking square hay bales by hand would be a common thing to be doing in this type of weather. Now, we hear – or look – at the temp and begin to "wilt" immediately – BIRTHDAYS??



Last February 27-28 when the power was off for almost ten hours, it was cold outdoors (too) with a wind. There was concern beginning – just think – if only we could have had a few of the degrees we are experiencing now back then – the example of extremes!

The heat has sure made lawn mowing less of a task – flowers continue to be showy – thanks to watering. Morning glories on the west side of the residence at 215 Lonsdale are extremely eye-catching. Also lilies (calla, we think) "jump out" at you in a few locations – red, pink and yellow. Some of the petunia displays are gorgeous – containers full and overflowing. The zinnias at 304 Lonsdale are again amazing – all flowers are great!

As this column is being prepared, we are "pie-watching" also – at 3:30 p.m. the temp in our kitchen is 30.6° - time out (literally). WOW – STOP THE PRESS – Monday a.m. – kitchen temp 21° - outside 13° - a variation or what? What a difference a day makes – think we'll make it for a few more days!

On the topic of food, we hear that there was a new item available at the Regina Ex this year – grilled cheese & crickets! Think we'll just listen to the crickets and not taste them!

We're hearing of break-ins/robberies in the area recently – a reminder to keep all properties locked and don't leave keys in vehicles – this may not prevent a theft but there's no sense in encouraging and making it easy for them either.

Although we complain about the high temperatures, we are fortunate not to have to deal with the fire situations they are experiencing in British Columbia where they have declared a province-wide state of emergency as hundreds of wildfires burn. The word is that smoke from these fires is going to be drifting east – Alberta is already experiencing high smoke levels and it is supposed to drift into Saskatchewan this week and even into Manitoba.





Our next scheduled date is September 1st when we'll be at the Wilson Threshing Day serving lunch (including pie, if course).



VISITORS TO OUR TOWN

"Scoop" is at it again! On Friday the 10th, we happened to meet an interesting traveler at the Post Office. Brian Nadon from Calgary is cycling across Canada bringing awareness of PTSD (post-traumatic stress disorder) to the public. Brian is the founder and director of Vatic Foundation – (Value – Achieve – Take Part – Inspire – Community).

It is a program set up to help people suffering from this ailment, i.e. education, scholarships. Peace keepers, soldiers, medical responders, etc. are commonly affected once they return to civilian life.

Recipe of the Month

Pickled Zucchini

1 cup white vinegar
1/3 cup granulated sugar
1/4 tsp salt
1 Tbsp chopped dill
3 zucchini, cut into ¼" rounds
1/2 red onion, thinly sliced



Boil vinegar with sugar and salt in a small saucepan. Stir in dill. Cool slightly.

Firmly pack zucchini and red onion into 250 ml Mason jars. Pour in vinegar mixture. Cover with lids and refrigerate for at least 12 hours.




