- That the Wastewater Works & Lagoon Compliance Inspection reports (completed July 17/18) be acknowledged – willows on NE side of secondary cell to be removed and gate to secondary cell be locked to stop unauthorized dumping.
- That approval be given to install a solar yard light at each of the electrical boxes in the valley event site.
- That approval be given to plant trees on north side of walkway joining Lions Park & Centennial Park (trees donated by Birnie's Greenhouse).
- Trees to be purchased to be planted around Camp Kitchen – Mayor Birnie to plant all the trees.
- Approval for building permit to construct a 40'x76' shop/garage on Lot 10A, Block C, Plan 102070976.
- Approval given for building permit for a 14'x14' sunroom attached to residence on Lot 24, Block 15, Plan 85R09763.
- That a council & staff potluck BBQ be held August 26/18 at the Camp Kitchen – meat to be ordered from MM Meats.
- That invoice from Wawota Health Care Foundation for 2018 – 2nd quarter physician services in the amount of \$5,000 be paid.
- That invoice from Aon Reed Stenhouse re increase of certain property values for the term May 22 – December 31/18 be paid – amount \$9,138.26.
- That accounts totaling \$76,122.68 for the month of July be paid.

ARE YOU GETTING ENOUGH WATER EVERY DAY?

(these statistics are for the American population but it transcends to many countries and cultures)

1. 75% are chronically dehydrated.
2. In 37%, the thirst mechanism is so weak that it is often mistaken for hunger.
3. Even MILD dehydration will slow down one's metabolism as much as 3%.

- 4 tbsp cocoa
- 1 tsp soda
- ½ tsp cinnamon

- 1 cup Mini chocolate chips (optional) divided into 2



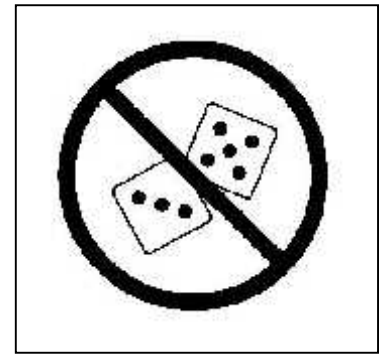
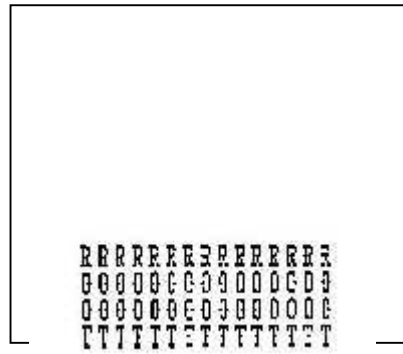
