## WANDERING THOUGHTS

(as we see them)

Fall officially arrives (arrived) on the 22<sup>nd</sup> – hope you enjoyed – and made the best of – the last week of summer. We hope to see more “summery” weather even if it is fall. We didn’t like to hear the word SNOW in areas to the north a few days ago. At press time we’ve yet to experience a general killing frost in our area! The weatherman seems a little confused, however still better than hurricanes and typhoons.



Harvest has come to a sudden halt – they tell us that 75 – 80% has been completed in this area. In general, we hear that a day or two up to a week would see most crops under cover. By the number of grain bags seen, this must be a sign of a better than expected yield.

Each day we are seeing more and more signs of fall approaching – cooling temps, falling leaves, less daylight hours, birds flocking and more. We see some homes decorated for the season – Thanksgiving, Halloween (631 Choo Foo Crescent), Walter Street and others.



Another sign is the appearance of maple bugs (probably known by another name – think you know what we mean – see below). They seem to like the warm afternoon sunshine gathering in clusters on foundations, trees, etc. Like their cousins the house fly, they seem to find a way to get indoors also.

Have you noticed the “art work” of local – or out of town – artists on Railway Avenue east (in front of the old Tire Shop) have made perfect shaped “donuts” (burned rubber on pavement)? This is not a new trend however it does show the “smarts”?? of those responsible!!

We are faced with a dilemma! We’re wondering if birds have a vision clause in their health plan? Why do we ask ... well, one day last week we left our vehicle in the driveway for less than 5 minutes – and yes, they left their “autograph” on the hood, windshield and roof in a colour similar to mountain ash berries!

Heard a “true human kindness” story last week. A very young boy was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer with only weeks left to live. One of his favourite things in this life was Christmas. ### ***You asked ??***

**Question:** What are “maple bugs”?

**Answer:** They are Boxelder bugs and are nuisance pests. They do not sting or transmit disease, and are generally not known to bite, though there are rare reports of defensive biting. Boxelder bugs are not known to cause damage to homes or significant damage to plants. However, their feces can stain light colored surfaces. Boxelder bugs eat by sucking the juices out of plants. In particular, they feed upon the juice contained in the seeds of boxelder trees and other trees in the maple family. Even in large numbers, boxelder bugs seem to do little damage to these trees. Boxelder bugs like warm areas and are attracted to buildings with a large southern or western exposure. To get rid of outdoor boxelder bugs, fill a spray bottle with water and liquid dish soap and spray the bugs to kill them. You can also sprinkle borax or food-grade diatomaceous earth around the perimeter of your home and plants to keep boxelder bugs away.

## VIAL OF LIFE ?

Vial of Life is a program that helps emergency personnel locate important medical details in the event of an emergency in the home. A vial containing all important medical information is stored in the refrigerator and a sticker on the fridge door alerts emergency personnel that the vial is inside. (Why the refrigerator? – They are common to every household and can be easily located in an emergency.)

The aim of the Vial of Life program is to help paramedics on the scene of an emergency by reducing the amount of time searching for basic medical and prescription information. Having this information easily accessible will also save time for emergency room and hospital personnel and facilitate the care process. In addition, seniors living alone may not have someone to help communicate important health information to emergency personnel. Someone (doctor, pharmacist, caregiver) could help in the filling out of the form re medications, allergies, doctor's name, next of kin, life support wishes, etc. It is very important the information is kept up to date.

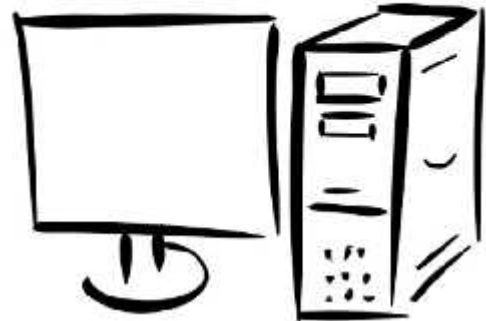

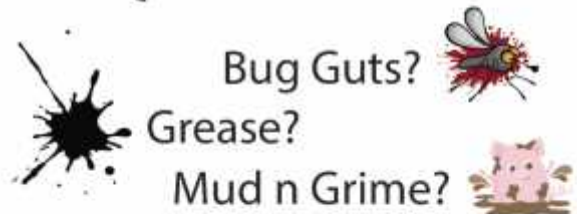
