CHRISTMAS RECIPE

Christmas Pepper Jelly

1½ cups cider vinegar

6 cups granulated sugar

- 4 cups peppers chopped fine (2 red, 2 green)
- 1 Tbsp lemon juice
- 1 pkg or 1 bottle Certo
- 2 tsp pepper flakes (optional)

Bring vinegar and sugar to boil, add chopped peppers and lemon juice. Cook for approximately 15 minutes. Add Certo and stir constantly while solution thickens. Pour in sterilized jars and seal. (Delicious with any kind of meat, scrambled eggs and more.)



GREAT SONGS OF CHRISTMAS AND HOW THEY CAME TO US

O Come, All Ye Faithful – This is one of the oldest hymns in the Christmas service, the first manuscript known to scholars dating from 1751, although the melody is much older. The translation of the Latin words now used in English-speaking countries was made in 1852.

The First Noel – This carol is believed to be of French origin, probably about 1500, although no one is really certain. Europe knew the song in the 17th century, but it made its first known appearance in print in 1883.

Joy To The World – Lowell Mason arranged the music for this carol in 1830, using a theme from the "Antioch" portion of Handel's Messiah. The words were written in 1719 by Isaac Watts, who did not intend them to apply to any special part of the church calendar.

Hark! The Herald Angels Sing – The words to this carol came before the music, written in 1793 by Charles Wesley, brother of the founder of the Methodist Church. 101 years later, the melody appeared in a cantata by Felix Mendelssohn. 15 years after that the words and music were joined by Dr. W.H. Cummings, then organist of Waltham Abbey in England – presented for the first time on Christmas Day 1885.

Silent Night, Holy Night – One of the most famous stories of all time surrounds the composition of this beautiful carol. It was written on Christmas Eve, 1818 in the Village of Oberndorf, Bavaria. The church organ had broken down and organist Franz Gruber and Vicar Joseph Mohr wanted music for the holiday services. Gruber wrote the music and Mohr the verses, and the carol was first heard the next day in a 3 part arrangement, accompanied by a guitar.

Away in a Manger – Although scholars dispute the point, many believe that this carol was written by Martin Luther for his children, and it is often called Luther's Cradle Hymn. There are several different melodies for the lyrics.

O Little Town Of Bethlehem – A young clergyman named Phillips Brooks wrote the poem for this carol, basing it on his memory to the Holy Land one Christmas. The children of his Sunday School so loved the poem that they asked Lewis Redner, the organist, to write music for it. Legend has it that Mr. Redner promised to write the music within a week, but after several days had not yet composed a note. He awakened during the night and sensed a melody running through his mind and leapt from his bed to write it down. Next morning the song was presented to the Sunday School. The church was that of the Holy Trinity in Philadelphia and the year was 1868.
