Also non-smokers are requesting time-out to coincide with their co-workers “smoke-breaks”, i.e. extra vacation days. Smokers are even considering this a fair concern.

Thursday (8th) will see a new \$10 bill in circulation – value will remain unchanged – still take ten to make a hundred.
