Last Friday saw a great evening of fellowship and entertainment in the beautiful Kennedy Memory Gardens. The action all began at 6:30 with musical entertainment by KO & Garry D – at 7:15, an intermission of 20 minutes was taken when delicious home-created pie a la mode and a beverage was served. However, if kept watered, the flowers (petunias, begonias, merigolds, lilies) are providing us with great splashes of colour in many yards throughout Town.

Also whilst travelling we see an increase of white butterflies – recall being told from previous years that they are the next stage of a certain bug that affects some crops?

The Sask Roughriders provided us with a great evening of football entertainment this past Sunday – winning against the previously “undefeated” Stampeders 40 – 27. Was the “turnaround” effort due to the fact that Coach Jones wore a green T-shirt over his usual black apparel??

A local resident informs us that he saw a porcupine crossing 200 block Main Street on Friday night. “Wildlife” has been reported in our Town before, however this could be a first (moose, muskrat, deer, coyote, skunk, etc.)
