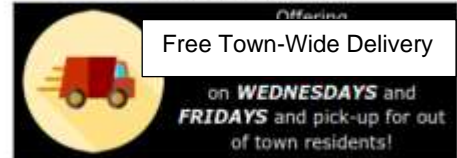

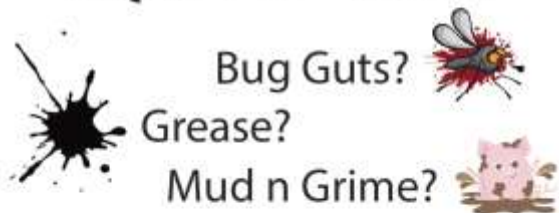

NEVER CUT RHUBARB

When picking rhubarb, always grab it at the base of the stalk and give it a good tug and twist to pull it out by the root.

The brains of the rhubarb plant are in its roots. When you pull the stalk out by the root, the rhubarb feels it and says to itself "Oh my goodness, I have lost a stalk, I'd better grow more stalks", and it does!

If you cut the stalk, the plant doesn't know to grow more stalks. What is left below your cut rots into the root. The rhubarb feels very badly then and doesn't grow another stalk.

Secondly, if you have had great pickings of rhubarb and the plant is quite depleted, they need some recovery time. Leave then for a couple of weeks to recover.

RHUBARB CAKE

1 ½ cups brown or white sugar
½ cup shortening
1 egg
1 tsp vanilla

Cream well, then add:

1 cup buttermilk or sour cream or milk
2 cups flour
1 tsp baking soda
1 tsp cinnamon
Pinch of salt



Stir till well blended, then add 2 heaping cups of cut rhubarb. Stir in batter, pour into 9"x13" pan and top with ½ cup brown sugar and 1 tsp cinnamon. Bake at 325°F for 40 minutes.
